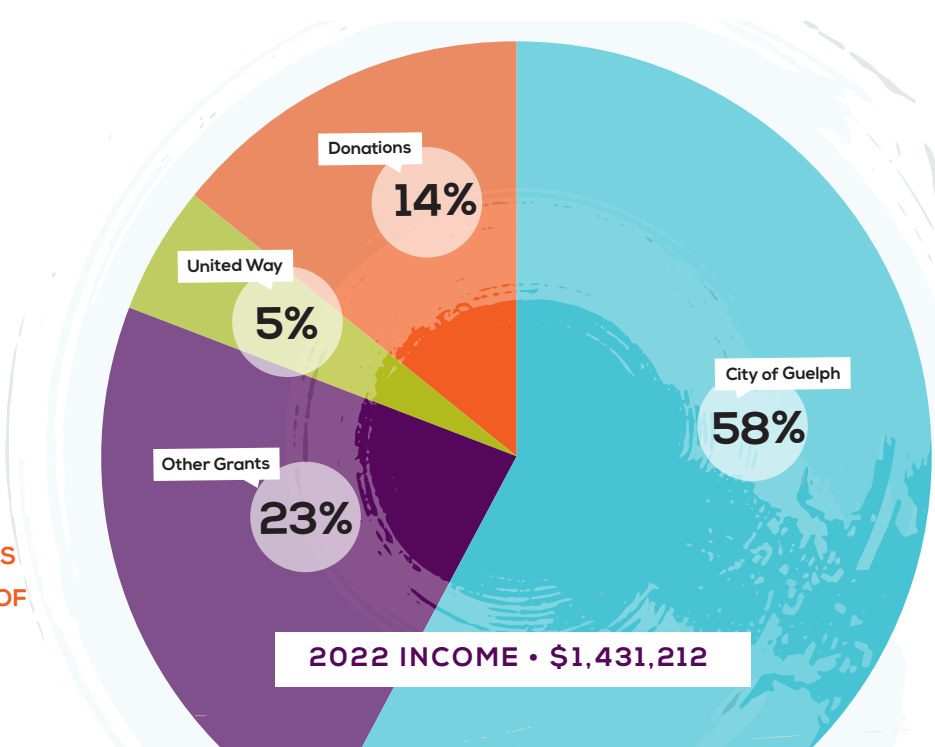

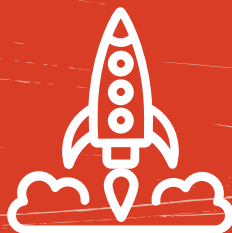

Hello Friends,
2022 was a hard and inspiring year. There were still so many people suffering from structural oppression. The need for essential items, that rose during the peak of the pandemic, has remained high. The work of the coalition is to always find partners and friends to learn from and share resources and ideas with to meet the needs of the community. Nothing ever happens in isolation.

2022 saw use return to some of the programs and services that we used to deliver as spaces and rules opened. We also got to partner on some amazing new projects. Two of note are:

FEWD (Food Equity With Dignity). This program, dreamed up and led by **Red Seal Chef Yasemin Zorlutuna**, takes food that would spoil or be thrown out and turns it into delicious meals that go out weekly to 6 different Neighbourhood Groups. The program launched in May, through the support of the Our Food Future (City of Guelph) and served **10,000 meals** and diverted **4 tons of food** from landfill!

Art In a Just Recovery. This beautiful program led by our good friends at **Art Not Shame** brought community together through art, care and sharing to ultimately create a community mural (that was unveiled June 7th at the Guelph Farmers’ Market in partnership with 10C).
